

Baruch Schwarz, Ph.D.



Baruch Schwarz is Professor Emeritus at the School of Education, Hebrew University of Jerusalem. His expertise ranges from educational psychology to the development of mathematical and scientific reasoning. He is a specialist in the role of argumentation in learning and development.

Baruch Schwarz has led several European R&D projects on the use of technologies to boost deliberative argumentation, productive discourse, collaborative learning, mathematical problem solving, and “learning to learn” skills. He is also involved in research on the moderation of collaborative learning and is active in the study of ultra-orthodox learning in Yeshivas.

Baruch Schwarz leads the Special Interest Group on Dialogue, Reasoning and Argumentation (SIG 26) within the European Association of Research in Learning and Instruction. He has published more than 200 publications on these topics. He is the Head of the Center for Dialogic Education, which is dedicated to fostering dialogic practices in the educational system – in schools and in higher education.
