Anna Heikkinen is Senior Lecturer of Management and Organizations and Academic Director of Responsible Business Master's Degree Programme at the Faculty of Management and Business, Tampere University, Finland. She is Adjunct Professor in Business Ethics and Sustainability at University of Eastern Finland. She is an internationally well-connected scholar, whose research is primarily in the areas of stakeholder theory, corporate sustainability and environmental issues in business, examining the relationships between business organisations and society. Her work has been published in edited volumes and international journals, such as Journal of Business Ethics, Business Communication Quarterly, and International Journal of Knowledge Management Studies.

Firm-nature stakeholder engagement (Anna Heikkinen, Johanna Kujala & Sybille Sachs)

For over three decades, the vital role of nature for all business and societal activity has been substantially discussed in management literature and stakeholder research. While stakeholder scholars focusing on nature have argued that nature should be granted the stakeholder status, the question of what kind of relationships firms can have with nature, i.e. how nature can be included in stakeholder engagement, has received little attention. Drawing on previous research on stakeholder theory and engagement, environmental ethics, and firm-nature relations, we propose a typology of firm-nature stakeholder relationships at the intersection of two dimensions: ethical orientation to nature and mode of interaction with nature. We discuss the implications of the typology for understanding firm-stakeholder engagement with non-human nature. We contribute to stakeholder theory by complementing the current social stakeholder focused understanding of stakeholder engagement with a nature-inclusive understanding.
